The model pictured looks to be a great learning tool. I was more fascinated with this than I should have been.




I look forward to more such events. And meeting more of you in the coming months.

## **CDAA** Update



#### Message from your Canadian Dental Assistants' Association President June 2022

#### Looking back and looking forward

For the past 21 months, it has been my great honor to serve as your CDAA President and as the acting representative of the Canadian Dental Assistants Association leadership team.

As we approach the upcoming 2022 AGM for the Canadian Dental Assistants Association, to be held in Ottawa June 12, 2022, we are excited that this will be the first time we are able to meet in person to conduct this important business for our profession since June 2019. We were extremely disappointed that the SARS CoV2 pandemic resulted in CDAA being forced to cancel our very much anticipated  $75^{th}$  Anniversary celebrations in 2020. It will be wonderful to return to our pre-pandemic annual gathering in 2022, not only to conduct the business of the CDAA but also to celebrate together the accomplishments of our association and the contributions that many individuals and organizations have made to the advancement of our profession over the past year.

When I took on the role of President during the SARS CoV2 pandemic in September 2020, we had already reopened dental practices across the country, albeit with time consuming new IPC protocols taking away from valuable treatment time. 




